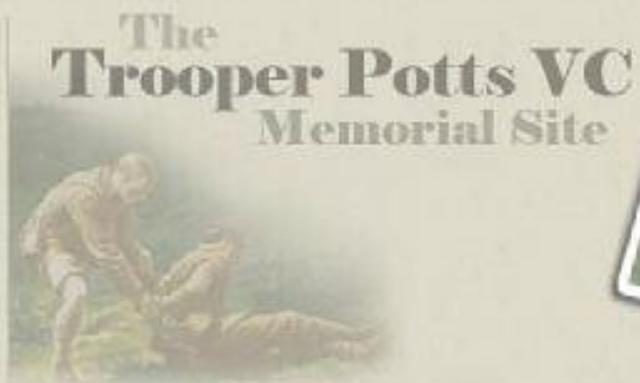

Inniscarra

Inniscarra, on the Bath Road, was rented from Trustees and offered 50 beds. Each ward was named after the person who donated the furniture. It opened 11th March 1916 and closed 28th March 1919. It treated 913 patients. It was a convalescent hospital operated by the Red Cross by Berks 68 VAD.

The Commandant was Mrs Henderson and the Medical Officers were Dr Cane, Dr Hurry, Dr Walters and Dr March.
