The three Pangbourne young men - Owen Clifford, William Nicholls and John Harper - reported as missing from the Berkshire Yeomanry at the Dardanelles were specifically and sympathetically mentioned by the Rector of Pangbourne at the service on Sunday morning. William Nicholls, it has been ascertained is wounded and is lying in the Netley Hospital near Southampton. No other further news of the other two is yet available.

Great regret will be felt that Sergeant F Palmer of the Royal Berkshire Yeomanry, son of Mr and Mrs W J Palmer of 21 Abbey Square Reading has been killed. He had been at Messrs Suttons since a boy and had belonged to the Yeomanry for a number of years. His age was 29. He was known as 'Pedlar' Palmer and played football for Suttons. His father is fireman Palmer and is employed at Suttons.

Deep regret is felt at Suttons at the death of Pedlar Palmer of the Berks Yeomanry. Of fine physique he played back (and sometimes forward) for Suttons FC. "one of the best" is a general description of him. Another brother has seen a great deal of service during the war.
